Bent-wood forms and iconic figures, set in intensely vibrant fields of color, evoke an inner space encompassing the artist's private musings on chaos and the act of creation. Some of the semi-abstracts are about, or inspired by, the anguish of Jewish children in Nazi concentration camps, the Diaspora, the Messiah myth and the stormy relationship of Freud and Jung.
