Macalister, whose terminology here, as usual, is in conformity with that of Continental anatomists, writes: The pubis consists of a body which forms a little less than one-fifth of the acetabulum. ; Quain, on the other hand, writes: The flat portion between the rami of the pubis is the body ; and Young, in his Synopsis of Human Anatomy (U.S.), follows Quain s usage. The Continental application of the term has, however, the advantage in the point of consistency, the body being then, in the case of each of the three elements of the hip-bone, the thickened portion taking part in the formation of the acetabulum, of which the body of the pubis constitutes...
